**Nunavut**  
Residents returning from NWT or Churchill, MB for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those returning from all other parts of Canada who are not fully vaccinated must isolate for 14 days at designated sites

**IV Inter-Provincial** 0.0

**Northwest Territories**  
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the territory for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate, but testing for those arriving in smaller communities; those who are partially vaccinated must self-isolate for 8 days and those who are unvaccinated for 10 days

**III Intra-Territorial** 0.0

**Yukon**  
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the territory for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; 14 day self-isolation required for those who are not fully vaccinated

**IV Inter-Provincial** 211.6

**British Columbia**  
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

**III Intra-Provincial** 13.6

**Alberta**  
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

**IV Inter-Provincial** 20.3

**Saskatchewan**  
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

**II Hyper Local** 42.4

**Manitoba**  
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; 14 day self-isolation required for those who are not fully vaccinated

**II Hyper Local** 70.6

**Ontario**  
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel are strongly advised to self-isolate for 14 days

**III Intra-Provincial** 17.1

**Quebec**  
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

**III Intra-Provincial** 10.9

**New Brunswick**  
Residents returning from Atlantic provinces for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those returning from all other parts of Canada who have not had at least one dose of vaccine are required to self-isolate for 5 to 7 days

**III Intra-Provincial** 2.6

**Newfoundland and Labrador**  
Residents returning from Atlantic provinces for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those who travelled outside of Atlantic Canada within 14 days of returning are required to self-isolate for 14 days

**III Intra-Provincial** 1.5

**Prince Edward Island**  
Residents returning from Atlantic provinces for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate if they have at least one vaccine dose and a PEI Pass; those who are unvaccinated or returning from all other parts of Canada are required to self-isolate for 8 days

**III Intra-Provincial** 0.0

**Nova Scotia**  
Residents returning from PEI or Newfoundland and Labrador are not required to self-isolate; those returning from all other parts of Canada who are partially vaccinated must self-isolate for 7 days and those who are unvaccinated for 14 days

**III Intra-Provincial** 5.0

Please note: An increase in search and bookings does not imply that residents are non-compliant with any current health restrictions in place, rather that there is an increased interest in travel. Actual travel could take place in the near future or at a later date.
