Nunavut
Residents returning from Churchill, MB for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those returning from all other parts of Canada who are not fully vaccinated must isolate for 14 days at designated sites.

II Hyper Local 198.2

Northwest Territories
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the territory for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those arriving in smaller communities; those not fully vaccinated must self-isolate for 10 days or until receipt of a negative test on day 8 or later.

IV Inter-Provincial 2,081.4

Yukon
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-territory for domestic leisure travel.

IV Inter-Provincial 1,219.9

British Columbia
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

IV Inter-Provincial 308.9

Alberta
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

IV Inter-Provincial 919.2

Saskatchewan
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

IV Inter-Provincial 705.3

Manitoba
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; 14 day self-isolation required for those who are not fully vaccinated.

IV Inter-Provincial 748.7

Ontario
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

IV Inter-Provincial 471.7

Quebec
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel. Residents returning to Nunavik or James Bay from out-of-province may be required to self-isolate.

IV Inter-Provincial 658.5

New Brunswick
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those not fully vaccinated must self-isolate for 14 days or until receipt of a negative test taken on day 10.

IV Inter-Provincial 292.9

Newfoundland and Labrador
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 5 days and follow testing procedures; those not fully vaccinated must self-isolate for 14 days or until receipt of a negative test result taken on day 7 or later.

II Hyper Local 856.9

Prince Edward Island
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside the province for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 4 days and follow testing procedures; those who are not fully vaccinated must self-isolate for 8 days and follow testing procedures.

III Intra-Provincial 1,000.5

Nova Scotia
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those who are not fully vaccinated must self-isolate for 7 days and follow testing procedures.

IV Inter-Provincial 513.1

Please note: An increase in search and bookings does not imply that residents are non-compliant with any current health restrictions in place, rather that there is an increased interest in travel. Actual travel could take place in the near future or at a later date.
